Reception Visit to Museum of Cannock Chase

On Tuesday our Reception children visited the Museum of Cannock Chase as part of their topic on Toys and Bears. Firstly they enjoyed a dance workshop where they became clockwork toys, robots and puppets. Next they had a lesson about toys and games in the past, including a story about the history of the teddy bear. They also had the opportunity to play with a selection of old toys, including whip & top and cup & ball.

The highlight of the day, as always, was the traditional Punch and Judy show which had the children in fits of laughter!

The children really enjoyed the day and learned and gained a great deal of information for their topic.

Y2 Literacy and SATs Workshop

Today parents of Y2 children were invited into school to take part in a Literacy and SATs Workshop. We like to take the opportunity at the start of workshops to share important information with parents and Mrs Hawkes gave a talk about our Anti-Bullying Policy and Internet Safety. Following this Mrs Hawkes explained how we teach Literacy in school and the assessments (SATs) the children will be undertaking in the summer term. The children then joined their parents to analyse the Little Red Riding Hood



text using inference skills, and to identify word classes and punctuation. They went on to plan their version of the story. Parents received a pack to support their children at home. Thank you to parents (and grandparents) for joining us and for the really useful feedback we received.


