### Visitors from China

This week we have hosted three young visitors from China. They have spent the majority of their time in Y2. Prior to their arrival the Year 2 children learnt to say 'hello' and more about China and the way of life there. The children have taken part in a full cultural experience, including a wide range of after school activities such as

riding, tennis, karate, boxercise and multi-sport sessions. In addition, staff in school provided a phonics lesson and an art lesson where each child produced their own Banksy inspired art work to take home to



China. They even starred in the Year 2 class assembly joining in with singing the National Anthem. It has been lovely to see how welcoming our pupils have been and how interested they are to share in the experiences. After a week of lessons, on Thursday afternoon our Year 2 pupils took part in a science session led by the exchange teacher investigating and making rockets. The week was rounded off by a day trip to Weston Park to experience life as an evacuee, which included a trip on a mini steam train. It has been lovely to see how enthusiastic all the children were and the links made. Our thanks to the staff and pupils for making the visitors feel so welcome, we have really enjoyed their visit.

### E-Safety Tip of the Week

Two Factor Authentication is an added layer of security offered by many online services. In many cases you need to activate or allow it to happen, but is well worth activating where possible. Two Factor Authentication forces you to confirm who you are by sending a code to your mobile number. This confirms the access is genuine, only you will know the account password and randomly generated passcode sent to your device. If someone is trying to access your account, the code you receive will be your prompt that someone maybe trying to access your accounts.
